### Our Curriculum: Success For All

The over-arching intent of the curriculum is a learning journey through a body of knowledge that is seen as a whole and not artificially compartmentalised into Key Stages.

We understand that all parents want to help their children learn, as well as to have a good understanding as to what they are learning. To facilitate this, we provide all students in KS3 with a booklet bag and booklets. These are taken home by the students so that you can see what your child has been learning, as well as how they have been progressing in lessons. The homework all follows a regular routine and has a consistent style, helping develop important revision skills as well as facilitate knowledge acquisition. The academic year is broken down into three cycles consisting of 12 weeks each. All of the knowledge and skills that are covered in the first 10 weeks are assessed, meaning that parents have the chance to support their children in succeeding in these assessments, as well as being provided with academic updates on their progress three times a year with our end of cycle reports."

We strive to provide a broad and balanced curriculum that engages, challenges, excites. The links between subjects and with the wider world are exploited so that the students can comprehend the world they live in through the knowledge they have internalised. The curriculum is progressive and equips students with core knowledge about the best that has been thought, written and designed: balancing Shakespeare plays; the study of a broad range of history from different perspectives and scientific reasoning; achieving mastery in mathematics and ICT; giving opportunities for creative excellence in art, drama, music and design technology; contributing to healthy and responsible citizens through food & nutrition, physical education and life skills.

In Years 7-9 we are committed to developing skills and interests and sparking imagination and creativity. As students move up through the college, we encourage them to be organised, reflective, independent, and good team workers, amongst other key life skills, to help them be successful in their future studies and the workplace.

The curriculum is designed in a manner to enable students to enjoy a wide variety of subjects from Years 7 to 11. We provide different pathways in Year 10 to enable students to focus on areas of the curriculum about which they are most passionate and interested and that are likely to play a more prominent role in their futures. Above all, we believe we provide a curriculum that enables everyone to find enjoyment and succeed.



# Wellbeing and Safeguarding: Where all students thrive

At Honiton Community College, we strive to ensure that all students are academically successful. However, we also work incredibly hard to ensure that students feel that they belong to something special. This sense of belonging is developed through House Breakfasts, team building activities, enrichment opportunities, and a host of other activities and events.

We have a strong safeguarding and wellbeing offer in the school. However, we have found that with calm and safe environments around the school, there has been a marked reduction in the student requests to access these services. ### Post-16


An important part of this is the example we set – all of our staff are active members of our professional community and committed to reflecting and improving our own practice no matter what stage of our career.

Our extended school programme offers a wide range of after- school and lunchtime activities. Our students begin their careers education in Year 7 and work through a careers programme. Enterprise skills, financial capability and well-being topics are explored through the Aspire and Life Skills programmes, helping students learn about the world of work and preparing them for adulthood. We stress the importance of informed choice and provide impartial CEIAG throughout a student's time at Honiton Community College. We inform students about the different career pathways available and help them make sound, informed choices at key milestones in years 9, 11 and 13.

### Our Sports Academy and PE Highly Able Programme provides opportunities for our elite athletes to excel in their field.

For those children moving from local primary schools, there is an opportunity to meet with the Head of Year 7 during the Summer term. This gives them the opportunity to discuss what the children are looking forward to and ask any questions they may have. Any worries or concerns can be identified and addressed prior to the start of the new academic year.

Each year we welcome students into other year groups from secondary schools and colleges both in the UK and abroad. Individual tours can be arranged and for those students that require additional support settling into College life, there is a an extensive support network to work closely with both the student and their family.
