

#### **Homework and Assessment Week**

Thank you for your support with homework so far this term. Students are getting settled into good routines and we are seeing excellent completion rates and progress in Sparx Science and Sparx Reader in KS3 and SENECA in KS4.

To support homework completion, we run a 'Catch-up' session every lunchtime in the Hub. Students are asked to attend if they have missed any homework and need to catch-up or they can attend to get ahead! They can bring their lunch and leave when they are up to date. We also run an after-school Independent Study Club, every day in C3. This is run by members of our Learning Support Team who are happy to help if needed. However, please note that there will be no after-school Independent Study Club on 20<sup>th</sup> Dec due to the early finish.

Next week is Assessment Week across the College (week 11 of the first cycle). For most of our students this will be a familiar part of their life at HCC, however, for Year 7 this will be the first time they have been through this routine. Teachers will be preparing and reassuring students in lessons. If students are unsure, encourage them to speak to their tutors and teachers. These assessments will then inform the teaching in Super Teach week (week 12 of the cycle).
