When I wrote to parents/carers in September regarding my sense of pride and excitement around leading Honiton Community College, I don't think that I was quite prepared for what I have experienced over the last halfterm. The sense of community and togetherness is apparent as you walk around the College. Our students seem genuinely hungry for success and their appetite for learning is one that I think would out-compete that of any school. I think that it is for these reasons that we have seen such a significant improvement in behaviour in lessons and around the College. This has ebbed out into the community, with a number of members of the public reporting the positive demeanour of our students in the local community.

To match the ambition of our students, we are working collaboratively with several other schools to enhance our curriculum, taking into account the significant additional capacity now afforded by focused learning environments in classrooms. Following student feedback, part of the changes to our curriculum will involve a standardisation to the way in which key vocabulary and other aspects of the curriculum are covered between subjects. Following parents/carers feedback, we will also seek to make our curriculum more accessible and understandable for parents/carers; providing easy to understand subject booklets in a rolling programme throughout the year.

Underpinning these improvements to our curriculum are the latest, - and most significant, - strategies identified in the field of the science of cognitive learning. These include: spaced practice; interleaving; dual coding and retrieval practice amongst a variety of other strategies which are proven to enhance and deepen learning and understanding developments. In order to ensure that our teachers are delivering the very best lessons for your child/children, we are also investing in coaching our teachers in the use of these techniques. Mrs Jefferies will be speaking at one of the upcoming parent/carer Engagement Group sessions about these developments.

There is much to be proud of at Honiton Community College. I recognise that the College is on a school improvement journey. I would like to thank parents/carers, students, and the wider community for all of their support over the past half term. Through student feedback sessions, we understand that this support has already translated into students feeling happier, safer and more able to learn. I am confident that the changes that we are making to the curriculum will maintain the trajectory of our college improvement

Reading through the contents of this newsletter, I am excited about the journey that we are all on together. Best wishes.

Honiton Community College welcomes a wellbeing dog to the Pastoral Team!



We have started the new school year with an exciting addition of a welfare dog to the Pastoral Team. At 4 years old, Poppy has joined a very experienced team to help provide pastoral and welfare support. She has previously worked in another Devon school and has moved across to HCC alongside her owner Natalie Hunt who is our new Pastoral Support Lead.

Poppy comes with very impressive credentials, and received top marks in her official Dog Assessment Report. As well as providing emotional support, evidence has shown that therapy dogs in a school setting can reduce

blood pressure, promote physical healing, decrease anxiety, fatigue and depression. They can also focus interaction, stimulate memory, boost problem-solving skills and improve attendance.

Natalie says "Poppy is an incredibly relaxed, calm dog and will play an integral role in our Pastoral Team, supporting the emotional wellbeing of our students and focused interventions with various students 1 or 2 days per week. She has already settled in very well and we're all enjoying the positive impact she has on our college community"





The College was successful in gaining accreditation for the first part of the Rainbow Flag Award. This means that we have demonstrated that the teachers here at HCC have been trained in dealing with any reports of LGBT+ bullying in college and are aware of making the College a more inclusive environment. An impressive £175 was raised which will make a difference to the patients and their families that access the support this charity gives.







Students' review of the Pilot Theatre Company's adaptation and production of Malorie Blackman's novel 'Noughts and Crosses' at the Northcott Theatre, Exeter.

As a GCSE Drama student who has been studying 'Noughts and Crosses' for a couple of years now, I really enjoyed the production. The part that really stuck out for me the most was the setting and the scenes. I think the company did a really good job designing the set, making it simple yet so good, and it really added to the production. The acting and actors were amazing, as were the costumes, but the setting just completed it. Using gauze as the background material, which can appear solid or transparent depending on how it is lit, made it so much more ominous and tense for scenes that that effect. It was honestly breath-taking. The lighting was constantly on point and fitted well with the scenes and setting. And the minimum use of props just made it all the better. I really enjoyed this production, and I would honestly recommend it to any GCSE Drama student studying 'Noughts and Crosses', it has really helped me be able to answer questions with so many different, in-depth answers.


